European Legislative Updates



Recovery and Resilience Facility: Ireland presents National Recovery and Resilience Plan to Europe

The draft <u>plan</u> involving projects with a value of almost €1 billion, will enable Ireland to access funding under the EU's Recovery and Resilience Facility, which forms the centrepiece of *NextGenerationEU*, the Union's response to the global pandemic. Ireland is expected to receive approximately €915m in grants under the RRF for the period 2021-2022. A further set of grants is to be allocated in 2023.

The draft Plan includes measures aimed at:

- -advancing the green transition;
- accelerating and expanding digital reforms and transformation; and
- -social and economic recovery and job creation

Agreement reached on the European Climate Law

The EU institutions reached a <u>provisional agreement</u> on the European Climate Law which enshrines the EU's commitment to reaching climate neutrality by 2050 and to reducing net greenhouse gas emissions by at least 55% by 2030, compared to 1990 levels.

Better Regulation

The Commission has adopted a <u>Communication on</u> <u>Better Regulation</u>, proposing several improvements to the EU law-making process. The Commission is stepping up efforts to simplify EU legislation and reduce its burden, while making better use of strategic foresight and supporting sustainability and digitalisation

Migration management: New EU Strategy on voluntary return and reintegration

The Commission has adopted the first <u>EU Strategy on voluntary return and reintegration</u>. The Strategy promotes voluntary return and reintegration as an integral part of a common EU system for returns, a key objective under the New Pact on Migration and Asylum.

EU Digital COVID Certificate

In record-breaking time, a deal was reached on the Digital Green Certificate on 20 May to "facilitate the safe free movement of citizens within the EU during the COVID-19 pandemic". The certificate is digital proof that a person has either been vaccinated against COVID-19 and/or received a negative test result or recovered from COVID-19.

National authorities are responsible for issuing the certificate, which can be stored on a mobile phone. It will help to ensure that restrictions currently in place can be lifted in a coordinated manner and travel inside the EU. It is expected to enter into force as from 1 July.

The member states' permanent representatives have already rubber-stamped the agreement and the European Parliament is expected to do the same during its next plenary session. Most importantly for Schengen and free movement of people in general across the Single Market, the regulators foresee a sunset clause stating that the rules will only apply for one year as from the entry into force.

Sustainable Finance and EU Taxonomy

The European Commission has adopted an ambitious and comprehensive <u>package of measures</u> to help improve the flow of money towards sustainable activities across the EU. By enabling investors to reorient investments towards more sustainable technologies and businesses, the measures will be instrumental in making Europe climate neutral by 2050.
